
LITERACY WEEK

Many types of writing were presented including informational reports, historical narratives, friendly letters, fairy tales, fictional narratives and poems.


Classes visited throughout the week and explored the writing from all grade levels.


LOVE IS LOUDER WEEK





School Uniforms:
